

Pennsylvania Council on the Arts artist and AAJ member Susan Novak is happy to announce that the Silk Art and Shibori Installation created during several months of res-idency with students from Hempfield High School in Greensburg, will be officially unveiled during a special ceremony on March 7, 2019. The unveiling will take place at 10:00 A.M. at the westbound New Stanton turn-pike service plaza just outside of Greensburg. This permanent part of The PA Turnpike Commission's "Art Sparks" program joins murals and other art installations at various other PA service plazas along the travel ways of our beautiful state. (Keep an eye out

for a local "Johnstown" reference in one of the pieces in your travels on the turnpike).

"Art Sparks" program - a statewide project by the PCA and PA Turnpike Commission was created to bring local student created art to the service plazas. Art installations are to be created outside of Philadelphia, Pittsburgh, Harrisburg and Somerset. The commission was excited about adding something different and commissioned Susan to help lead the creation of a silk art installation.

Each school got to title their own art so "Commonwealth Threads" was chosen by the Hempfield students to reflect both the use of fiber arts and the connection between the individual six silk banners. Susan nick-named her silk design team members from Hempfield High School "The Shibori Squad" since their piece featured the traditional Japanese craft (Shibori silk art) which is a unique way of honoring the history of PA.

If you visit the PA Council on the Arts facebook page you can see im-ages of other student murals as well as clips of the unveiling ceremonies. A more abstract Shibori set of panels was also created to be used as a silk installation in the Hempfield High School library to make a quiet more private nook.
