# FORMER AAJ SCHOLARSHIP WINNER NAMED 'FORBES 30 UNDER 30'

Olivia Locher's "I Fought the Law" is a show of photographs illustrating the quirky and often ridiculous laws that either are or used to be on the books of the various 50 states. Who knew that serving wine in teacups was illegal in Kansas, or that it was a crime to undress in front of a portrait of a man in Ohio? Olivia broke laws in all 50 states and photographed the results. Her exhibition was on view at Steven Kasher Gallery this Fall, and a book to accompany the show was published by Chronicle Books, with a forward by Kenneth Goldsmith and an interview of Locher by Eric Shiner, former director of the Andy Warhol Museum.

Olivia's work has been exhibited internationally and has appeared in magazines such as the New York Times Magazine, W, Neon, Vanity Fair Italia, and Glamour, among others. She has been profiled in Interview Magazine, Wired, Slate, and Allure, as well as featured on the PBS News Hour. She was named as one of Forbes '30 Under 30' for photography in Art and Style category.

Olivia is the daughter of Bill and Marianne Locher of Johnstown, and was homeschooled during her high school years. After receiving a scholarship from AAJ in 2009, she attended the School of the Visual Arts, graduating with a BFA degree in 2013. She currently resides in Manhattan, NY.
