Now Through March 17th-EXHIBIT: "FRANK MASON-A PASSION FOR PAINTING"

A solo exhibition at University Museum at IUP will be on display through March 11. 76 works of art by Frank Mason offer an impressive selection of portraits, land-scapes, religious and other still life paintings from throughout Mason's prolific career. Text panels in 8 gallery rooms highlight Mason's biography and painting style. Mason was a mid-20th century painter, student and then instructor in the Art Students League of New York. He was also an art conservation activist. He mastered the technique of painting rather than the theory.

Historical Society, Laurel Arts to Feature Fiber Arts as they Explore and Exhibit "Common Threads"

Laurel Arts is partnering with the Somerset Historical Society to host a special series of events showcasing Fiber Arts, exclusively! *Common Threads* will celebrate, educate, explore and exhibit the wide variety of domestic, historical and contemporary fiber arts and the artists who make them throughout the spring and summer of 2017.

A symposium style event is planned for Sat., Apr. 22, 2017. Fiber artists will demonstrate and sell their products at Somerset Historical Center. The public is invited to meet the artisans and learn about their unique art-making processes, including hands-on activities. Featured keynote speaker Melinda Zonger of the National Museum of the American Coverlet. The Somerset Historical Center will also present a historical flax-scutching demonstration.
