For each 3 month interval, AAJ would like to exhibit the works of 3 to 4 members who volunteer to have their works on display. Exhibiting at the library has many advantages for an AAJ member, including exposure in a highly populated public area, the library is open 6 days a week with many scheduled events open to the public and, of course, the opportunity to possibly sell your work. Please check the exhibit schedule below and decide when it best suits you to be included in one of these exhibits. The following is the schedule of drop-off and pick-up dates for each exhibit period. These dates may be adjusted depending upon the library and AAJ's schedule of events.

Cambria County Library – 2012 Exhibit Schedule / Drop-off & Pickup dates for art work:

Pick-up - May 7 (NOTE: This exhibit is currently on display.)

Drop-off – May 14 Pick-up – August 20

Drop-off – August 27 Pick-up – December 3

Please note the following:

-Each member should choose 4 or 5 pieces to be hung. The library is open on Mondays

(Drop-off and pick-up days) from 8:00am to 8:00pm. Drop off is at the Reception Desk on the 3rd floor. Tell the receptionist you are dropping off art work for the Classic Corner which Sandie Hinterliter is coordinating.

- -Art work can be pieces that have been exhibited previously.
- -Art work that is purchased will be tagged as sold and remain on display for the duration of the exhibit.
- -Checks will be made out to AAJ. AAJ will receive the customary 20% commission. No commission is required by the Library, but donations are appreciated.
- -The following information regarding each piece to be displayed must be reported prior to the drop off date;

ARTIST NAME, TITLE OF WORK, MEDIUM, SALE PRICE. This information is needed to produce tags to be placed beside each work and the information should be e-mailed to Diane Safko at: aaj@johnstownart.com.

- -Please provide a brief artist profile which will be posted in the display area (what clubs you belong to, your art background/education, an artist statement about your work or art in general). Take it with you when you drop off your art work.
- -While art work is at the library it will be covered under the library's insurance policy up to \$25,000-total value.
